

ELIGIBILITY PROGRAMS FOR OLDER INDIVIDUALS

Programs for older individuals are conducted by a State or local government agency or nonprofit activity that receive funds appropriated for services or programs for older individuals under the Older Americans Act of 1965, as amended, under title IV or title XX of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 601 et seq.), or under titles VIII and title X of the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2991 et seq.) and the Community Services Block Grant Act (42 U.S.C. 9901 et seq.)

These include services that are necessary for the general welfare of older individuals such as social services, transportation, nutrition, legal and multipurpose senior centers.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Completed *Virginia State Surplus Property* application
- For nonprofits, a copy of the determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service stating that your organization is income tax-exempt under Section 501.
- Detailed narrative description (brochure) of the services the program provides including type of services offered, number individuals served, facilities, staff information and certification, etc.
- For public agencies, a copy of the program's current financial records with budget showing appropriated funds from State, county, or local government.
- **Certification with the following:**
 1. Verification showing receipt of appropriated Federal funds for the operation of the program from the State agency designated to administer programs authorized under legislation enumerated in section 214 of the Older Americans Act of 1965, as amended.
 2. Description of the program and facilities operated by the applicant. Must state the expiration date of the certification. Eligibility will be limited to the period covered by the certification.
 3. Certifications are generally issued on an annual basis; eligibility will be updated accordingly.
